MISSION & VISION

MISSION — Providing arts experiences for all K-8 students in the greater Sacramento region by strategically coordinating and mobilizing arts resources because children need opportunities to create, to communicate, and to learn to think in new ways.

VISION — We commit to meaningful and diverse arts learning experiences for any given child. Community partnerships ensure that all K-8 children access quality arts opportunities, thereby creating a long lasting arts education culture in our schools, families, and community.

GOALS FOR ARTS EDUCATION

The Community Arts Team set the following long-term goals for arts education in Sacramento.

- Provide high quality arts exposure experiences to participating school districts
- Provide high quality arts residencies to participating school districts
- Increase professional development opportunities for both arts educators and school personnel
- Increase the capacity of the Sacramento arts education community
- Build a strategic arts education delivery system
- Develop marketing and fundraising plans to support arts education in Sacramento

MILESTONES

August 2015-June 2016—Year 6 of implementation included 34 residencies (10 arts-integrated, 24 theme-based), focusing on theatre and music, in two school districts. The seven Residency Artists participated in three residency-specific workshops, and were joined by their host teachers for two of them. An additional nine workshops were open to all teachers and artists, providing professional development in arts integration to 111 participants. 68 schools received at least one Arts Exposure Experience, provided by one of 12 local arts organizations.

August 2014-June 2015—In year 5 of implementation Elk Grove School District joined **Any Given Child**, bringing the number of participating districts to 4. 126 artists, teachers, arts specialists and administrators participated in 9 workshops, with 5 more workshops held especially for the 10 artists on the Residency Artist Team. The 22 teachers who hosted residencies attended two of these special workshops with their teaching artist partner. 23 arts-integrated residencies and 4 theme-based residencies were completed in two districts. Arts organizations provided Arts Exposure Experiences to 56 campuses, serving 20,672 students in three districts.

August 2013-June 2014 —Year 4 of implementation served 250 artists, teachers and administrators across 15 **Any Given Child** workshops. Integrated arts residencies were expanded from 6 weeks to 10 weeks of instruction. Robla and Twin Rivers approved plans to hire more FT arts specialists over the next 3 years. Schools and the arts community were re-surveyed for the first time since the original **Any Given Child** surveys.

July 2013—**Any Given Child** Sacramento becomes a program of Friends of the Arts Commission through a unanimous vote with three **Any Given Child** leaders joining the Friends Board and other members of the collaborative taking positions on Board committees.

In year 3 of implementation, Robla and San Juan Unified School Districts join **Any Given Child**. 25 arts-integrated residencies are held in two school districts, serving 750 students. Arts organizations provide 83 arts exposure experiences in 4 districts, reaching 22,172 students. Ten professional development workshops are provided for teachers, arts specialists, and teaching artists in the 4 participating districts.

September 2012—The City of Sacramento transfers its financial duties to Sacramento Region Community Foundation as an interim fiscal sponsor for **Any Given Child**.

August/September 2012—The 3rd year of implementation launches with an expanded roster of arts providers (24, up from 18). 212 teachers, administrators, teaching artists and arts specialists received professional development under **Any Given Child**, through 10 seminars and workshops.

February 2012—The Governance Committee holds a Strategic Planning Retreat and identifies six Major Strategic Directions to guide the work for the next several years, and in May 2012, adopts a new Missions and Vision statement.

In year 2 of implementation, 204 teachers, administrators, teaching artists, and organizations receive professional development provided by Kennedy Center presenters in 6 seminars and workshops. 89 schools receive an arts exposure experience and 25 classrooms receive an artist residency.

March 2011—Kennedy Center staff visit Sacramento to meet with the Governing Council, view the work in schools, and attend a press conference with Mayor Kevin Johnson.

In year 1 of the Implementation Phase, Sacramento provides 35 arts residencies in 6 schools for 875 students, and arts assemblies/field trips for 89 of 112 schools in the two districts, reaching 37,000 students.

March-April 2010—The Community Arts Team sets long-term goals for arts education in Sacramento based on the results of the surveys. The findings of the surveys are presented to the Sacramento community at a public event.

January/February 2010—The Community Arts Team collects data from surveys distributed to schools, arts organizations, and community members in Sacramento.

October 2009—Sacramento hosts a press conference to announce participation in **Any Given Child**.

July 2009—The Kennedy Center selects Sacramento, CA as the first **Any Given Child** site.
